


Huskisson Woollamia Community Voice

We need a plan for aged care

The crisis we have seen unfolding in aged care across the country over the last several months is absolutely unacceptable. The Prime Minister has continually refused to take responsibility for what is happening and has failed our vulnerable older citizens time and time again.

The government knew about the problems in aged care months ago, but they have done nothing to address them.

That is why Labor has recently announced a plan for the aged care crisis which includes:

1. Minimum staffing levels in residential aged care;

2. Reduce the home care package waiting list so more people can stay in their homes for longer;

3. Ensure transparency and accountability of funding to support high quality care;

4. Independent measurement and public reporting as recommended by the Royal Commission;

5. Ensure adequate personal protective equipment in every residential aged care facility;

6. Better staff training, including on infection control;

- 7. A better surge workforce strategy; and
- 8. Provide additional resources so the Royal Commission can inquire specifically into COVID-19 across the sector without delaying its final report.

Older people in our community deserve better than what the Morrison Government has been doing. I sincerely hope the government takes up Labor's plan as a matter of urgency.



Celebrating local projects

On Saturday, I had the pleasure of attending the official opening of the Shoalhaven Heads Rural Fire Service Extensions and Tanker handover. It was wonderful to have the opportunity to celebrate such a positive milestone for one of our local RFS brigades. Once again, I would like to thank all our amazing RFS volunteers and workers for all you have done to protect our community this year, and every year.

I was also pleased to help turn the sod on the new Far North Collector Road development which is being undertaken thanks to \$13.8 million in Federal funding. This project will connect Taylors Lane, Cambewarra to the roundabout at McMahons Road and Illaroo Road North Nowra. It will hopefully ease traffic on the Illaroo Road and Princes Highway intersection, and I am thrilled to see it progressing.

On Friday, I was also excited to attend the opening of the Eurobodalla Repair Cafe at the Red Door Hall. It was lovely to talk with volunteer repairers and hear their stories. Well done to the South Coast Health and Sustainability Alliance on this great initiative. The Repair Cafe is open each Friday 10am-2pm - pop on in with your item and have a chat and cuppa.





JobKeeper changes pass the Parliament

Last week, the government's changes to the JobKeeper legislation passed the Parliament. I know how important this subsidy has been for local people, local businesses and local jobs. But many of the problems JobKeeper has had from the start have still not been fixed. I was glad to have a brief opportunity to <u>share</u> <u>some local stories</u> as part of the legislation debate.

The government has already <u>removed JobKeeper from early educators</u> and I don't want to see this lifeline taken away from businesses that need it. This is particularly true for businesses impacted by the bushfires.

I want to ensure that local people are getting the help they need, when they need it. So I will continue raising local stories to let the government know we can't lose JobKeeper too soon.



Commemorating local veterans

In recent weeks I have been <u>proud to attend</u> three local ceremonies to honour and commemorate our veterans.

This year we mark 75 years since the end of the Second World War, a momentous occasion. Like many things this year, though, our commemorations have been hampered by COVID-19, with services across the South Coast scaled down or, sadly, cancelled altogether. I joined a small group of veterans at the Nowra War Memorial to mark the occasion, with the Nowra and Bomaderry RSL sub-branches managed to put together a fitting yet safe tribute.

I was also proud to join with the Sussex Inlet RSL sub-branch for a combined commemorative service to mark Vietnam Veterans' Day, National Servicemens' Day, the Korean War Ceasefire Day and VP Day. I was absolutely honoured to present special commemorative medallions to some of our surviving World War II veterans as well as saluting their service awards to 18 local veterans. It was a moving and special service.

At sunset on Vietnam Veterans Day, I also joined with the Shoalhaven Vietnam Veterans' Association to honour those who had made the ultimate sacrifice for our freedoms. It was fantastic to see a good community turnout as well as many local veterans.

To <u>mark the end of the Second World War</u>, the Australian Government has now made <u>special commemorative medallions</u> available to all living World War II veterans.
